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REPORT:

ARIZONA'S HEALTHCARE COST CRISIS REVEALED

A new survey of likely voters in Arizona reveals the toll that high-cost care and prescription drugs are taking on families across the state. The numbers are clear - many Arizona residents are delaying needed and cost barriers are preventing others from receiving treatment prescribed by a doctor — all realities that could lead to worse health outcomes.



KEY FINDINGS

METHODOLOGY

The findings are from a multi-channel survey of 600 likely general election voters in Arizona between April 29 - May 4, 2021. Interviews were conducted by live telephone and via web-based panel. Interviews conducted via web-based panel were matched back to a corresponding voter file. The confidence interval overall is +/-4.0% within each state.
